A. Sounds and Letters

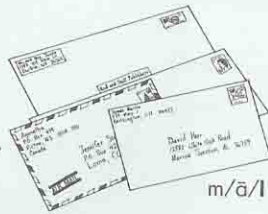
- When /f/ or /l/ is at the end of a one-syllable word and follows a short vowel sound, /f/ or /l/ is usually spelled **ff** or **ll**.

cliff well

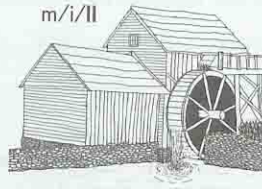
