

Notes on Part B

(Ex. 2) It is helpful to remember that *-al* is a common adjective suffix: rural, local, natural. *Principal* may be considered the adjective form of *prince*.

(Ex. 4) Sentence *c* is a useful method by which to remember the meaning of *rural*.
